The times of concentration camps seem to be behind us, but the methods are still used.

After occupying Crimea, Russia used the detention centre in Simferopol (ZISO-1) to place people opposing the occupation or criticising the authorities, including many Crimean Tatars. Detainees were tortured, treated inhumanely, and denied medical aid. The facility's conditions are deplorable. It has been extremely overcrowded.

Detainees at SIZO-1 experienced torture, which is forbidden by <u>international</u> and <u>Russian law</u>. It includes inflicting severe physical or mental suffering by an official for a specific purpose, such as obtaining information or punishment. Less severe suffering may constitute inhuman treatment.

Detainees did not get medical care, and the Centre was <u>overcrowded</u>. Its maximum capacity is 747, but it has had up to 1800. Political detainees were kept in a special block with severe conditions and isolation.

In one case, the guards kept a detainee on the floor for five hours and hit him in the head. In other cases, there were unnatural deaths.

Editor Aleksey Nazimov and politician Pavel Stepanchenko were detained in 2016. They had criticised the United Russia Party of President Putin. The head of the facility ignored requests for medical help from Nazimov despite his suffering from illness for six months. Stepanchenko suffered from a toothache for months without medical aid. When they were taken to court for a whole day, they would not receive any food.
